

Dr. Edward N. Tihen (1924-1991) was an avid reader and researcher of Wichita newspapers. His notes from Wichita newspapers -- the "Tihen Notes," as we call them -- provide an excellent starting point for further research. They present brief synopses of newspaper articles, identify the newspaper -- Eagle, Beacon or Eagle-Beacon -- in which the stories first appeared, and give exact references to the pages on which the articles are found. Microfilmed copies of these newspapers are available at the Wichita State University Libraries, the Wichita Public Library, or by interlibrary loan from the Kansas State Historical Society.

1. Report of death this morning of pioneer Kansas stock rancher, M. C. Campbell, at his home, 1313 North Emporia, at age 83. Born September 6, 1849 at Crete, Will County, Illinois, the fifth son in a family of six boys and three girls. In June 1874 he pre-empted land near Great Bend, Kansas. Married Sarah Ellen Smith in October 1876. Moved to Wichita in 1879. Survived by two daughters, Mrs. Jesse C. Harper and Mrs. Claudius C. Stanley, both of Wichita, one brother, James C. Campbell, of Wichita, and two sisters (named -- in California and Illinois). Further biography. Photograph.

- 1D. Feature article about the mansion built in 1884 by Wichita lumber baron, George Pratt, at 1313 North Emporia. The house was purchased last September by Dr. and Mrs. Garry Porter (she is Nan Morgan Porter and is great-granddaughter of George Pratt). They moved in in late February. Her grandmother is Mrs. George Brown, a life-long Wichitan who lived in the house until she was 11 years old. Around turn of the century the house was sold to a member of the Campbell family.
