Dr. Edward N. Tihen (1924-1991) was an avid reader and researcher of Wichita newspapers. His notes from Wichita newspapers -- the "Tihen Notes," as we call them -- provide an excellent starting point for further research. They present brief synopses of newspaper articles, identify the newspaper -- Eagle, Beacon or Eagle-Beacon -- in which the stories first appeared, and give exact references to the pages on which the articles are found. Microfilmed copies of these newspapers are available at the Wichita State University Libraries, the Wichita Public Library, or by interlibrary loan from the Kansas State Historical Society.

To be of pressed brick trimmed in Carthage stone and cost \$18,000. Architect is Fred C. McCune. Contract let to Dieter and Wenzel Construction company.

Says the transmission line for the Arkansas Valley Interurban will cost \$43,000.

Height from floor of stage to dome is 80 feet. Stage opening is 60 feet wide. ¶ Forum was designed by Richards, McCarty and Bulford, architects of Columbus, Ohio, and constructed by the Dieter-Wenzel Construction company. Construction of the building was commenced last March and cornerstone laid by Mayor Davidson May 19.

12. Contract has been let to Dieter and Wenzel for remodeling some interior rooms of the City Building including the council chamber. Details.
