1D. *St. Joseph Medical Center*, formerly St. Joseph Hospital and Rehabilitation Center, yesterday began moving the first 100 of approximately 300 patients into its new facility at Clifton and Harry Streets. Some finishing touches still remain to be done on the new seven story, 400 bed hospital building. The west campus building-the old hospital-will continue to be used for various departments. Two of the buildings facing Zimmerly Street have been leased to the Wichita Catholic Diocese for a five story Catholic Center for the Aging. Details.
