Dr. Edward N. Tihen (1924-1991) was an avid reader and researcher of Wichita newspapers. His notes from Wichita newspapers -- the "Tihen Notes," as we call them -- provide an excellent starting point for further research. They present brief synopses of newspaper articles, identify the newspaper -- Eagle, Beacon or Eagle-Beacon -- in which the stories first appeared, and give exact references to the pages on which the articles are found. Microfilmed copies of these newspapers are available at the Wichita State University Libraries, the Wichita Public Library, or by interlibrary loan from the Kansas State Historical Society.

# Wichita Beacon Tuesday, May 8, 1894 page

4. Board of education meeting yesterday: Number of pupils enrolled in public schools is 4,954. ¶ Discussion of need to reduce expenses in the present hard times. ¶ Wichita has 21 school buildings with total of 105 principals and teachers, including city superintendent. The high school has a principal and eight assistants. The Normal school has a principal and two assistants. There are 19 grade buildings with 19 principals and 71 teachers. There is a city superintendent and three supervisors, in drawing, penmanship, and music. Other salaried persons are the school board's secretary, treasurer, librarian, superintendent of buildings and grounds, and board of city examiners. ¶ Total expenditures for the year just ending will be about \$80,000, of which \$68,500 will have gone for salaries, \$4,500 for repairing of buildings, \$3,600 for supplies, \$2,000 for fuel, and \$2,000 for printing, insurance, rent, and miscellaneous. ¶ President Powell calls for a reduction in expenditures of \$20,000 for the coming year.

# Wichita Eagle Thursday, July 18, 1907 page

6. Work on the new quarters for the city library in the fourth floor of the City hall is progressing rapidly. A new steel ceiling has been placed in the old normal school room, which is the largest room on that floor and will be used as the main room for the library. The library is to occupy the entire fourth floor of the City hall. The offices of the board of education now on that floor will be moved down to the rooms on the second floor now occupied by the library. This move would have been made years ago if there had been an elevator in the City hall. Now that an elevator has been installed, the change will be made as soon as possible.
