Dr. Edward N. Tihen (1924-1991) was an avid reader and researcher of Wichita newspapers. His notes from Wichita newspapers -- the "Tihen Notes," as we call them -- provide an excellent starting point for further research. They present brief synopses of newspaper articles, identify the newspaper -- Eagle, Beacon or Eagle-Beacon -- in which the stories first appeared, and give exact references to the pages on which the articles are found. Microfilmed copies of these newspapers are available at the Wichita State University Libraries, the Wichita Public Library, or by interlibrary loan from the Kansas State Historical Society.

Property owners of Pawnee Ranch residence area yesterday protested the proposed ten year franchise for Suburban Transportation Company, formerly the Defense Transportation Company, unless service is improved. The protest asked also for an "interconnection with the Wichita Transportation Company of a transfer basis," decreased fare, safety and health code observance, and improved equipment. If the present operator fails to meet the requirements, transfer of the franchise to the Wichita Transportation Company was asked. The Suburban Transportation Company serves Planeview and the Boeing Airplane Company. Pawnee Ranch, Riverside township, is outside of Wichita, south of Pawnee between Hillside and the drainage canal.
