#### Content Note

This collection contains photographs and newspaper clippings documenting Strong Hinman's role as director of physical education for the Fort Dodge, Iowa, and Wichita, Kansas, public schools. Also included in this collection are pictures of track, football, and baseball teams coached by Hinman, as well as images of a Lions Club baseball trip to Hot Springs, Arkansas.

#### Biography

Strong Hinman was born on November 27, 1893, and attended Fairmount College from 1912 to 1916, lettering in basketball, football, track, and baseball. He received professional training in physical education at the YMCA Training School in Springfield, Massachusetts. From 1917 to 1920 Hinman was the supervisor of physical education for public schools in Fort Dodge, Iowa, before assuming the same position in Wichita in 1921.

In 1936 Hinman became the President of the American Physical Education Association, and also received the organization's National Honor Award. During the 1930s, Strong also published two

books on physical and health education in elementary schools. In the late 1930s and 1940s he was the Director of Health and Physical Education for the Kansas City, Missouri, public school system. Hinman was inducted into WSU's Shocker Sports Hall of Fame in 1981, and died in Wichita on December 26, 1983.
