Literary Rights

Content Note

The collection contains 36 manuscript letters and one typescript letter written by Alfred Coppard. The letters were written between the years 1919 and 1932, and they contain personal correspondence as well as critiques on contemporary literature. The majority of the letters were written to C. Ewart Askew. The collection also includes a typed brief summary of each letter.

Biography

Alfred Edgar Coppard (1878-1957) was a 20th century English writer of tales, fiction and verse. He was born in Folkestone, Kent, 4 January 1878; the family moved to Brighton in 1883. Coppard was educated at Lewes Road Boarding School in Brighton, 1883-1887. He apprenticed from 1887 to 1890 to a tailor in Whitechapel, London. Coppard was married to Lily Annie Richardson, who died in 1905. Later he remarried to Winifred May de Kok, and they had one son and one daughter.

Coppard worked a wide range of occupations before he became a full-time writer in 1919. By the age of 20, Coppard had been employed as paraffin vendor assistant and later a soap agent. He moved to Oxford in 1907, where he worked as a confidential clerk for the Eagle Ironworks until 1919.

Coppard is considered one of the leading short story writers of his day, both as lyric poet and teller of tales. Coppard's tales are rich and his prose is pungent with the flavor of the English countryside,
