

Dr. Edward N. Tihen (1924-1991) was an avid reader and researcher of Wichita newspapers. His notes from Wichita newspapers -- the "Tihen Notes," as we call them -- provide an excellent starting point for further research. They present brief synopses of newspaper articles, identify the newspaper -- Eagle, Beacon or Eagle-Beacon -- in which the stories first appeared, and give exact references to the pages on which the articles are found. Microfilmed copies of these newspapers are available at the Wichita State University Libraries, the Wichita Public Library, or by interlibrary loan from the Kansas State Historical Society.

He left Wichita about eight years ago after five years residence, but has been a frequent visitor since, from his present home at McAlester, Oklahoma. First came here in 1917 to open his store, which is now under management of Dan H. Holmes, his youngest son. First location of store was at 325 East Douglas, and it was moved to present location at 309 East Douglas in January 1920. Survived by wife, three sons: Dan H., of Wichita, H. Allen, who owned the Wichita Beacon from 1907 to 1928. ¶ Born in Pleasanton, Kansas and joined the foreign service in 1925. Left the foreign service in 1937 and returned in 1948. ¶ Survived by his widow, Henrietta Allen Holmes, a daughter, Mrs. William Peck, of Detroit, Michigan, and two sons, Henry Allen and Richard Peyton, also of Washington, D.C., and four grandchildren.
