

Dr. Edward N. Tihen (1924-1991) was an avid reader and researcher of Wichita newspapers. His notes from Wichita newspapers -- the "Tihen Notes," as we call them -- provide an excellent starting point for further research. They present brief synopses of newspaper articles, identify the newspaper -- Eagle, Beacon or Eagle-Beacon -- in which the stories first appeared, and give exact references to the pages on which the articles are found. Microfilmed copies of these newspapers are available at the Wichita State University Libraries, the Wichita Public Library, or by interlibrary loan from the Kansas State Historical Society.

2. City commission yesterday purchased a site on Kellogg between Dellrose and Oliver as the location for the new fire station Number 9. The site fronts 125 feet on Kellogg, east from Dellrose and is 150 feet deep. Cost of the site was \$2750. Details.

10. Contract has been let for the new fire station Number 9 at Kellogg and Dellrose. Details.

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5. In the election Tuesday Wichita voters passed a \$512,000 bond issue for new school buildings by 27,267 to 11,585 and a \$53,000 bond issue for a new fire station near Kellogg and Oliver by 27,625 to 13,315.

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3. City commission yesterday selected northeast corner of Kellogg and Dellrose as site for new \$53,000 fire station Number 9.
