

*Dr. Edward N. Tihen (1924-1991) was an avid reader and researcher of Wichita newspapers. His notes from Wichita newspapers -- the "Tihen Notes," as we call them -- provide an excellent starting point for further research. They present brief synopses of newspaper articles, identify the newspaper -- Eagle, Beacon or Eagle-Beacon -- in which the stories first appeared, and give exact references to the pages on which the articles are found. Microfilmed copies of these newspapers are available at the Wichita State University Libraries, the Wichita Public Library, or by interlibrary loan from the Kansas State Historical Society.*

1. Board of Regents today chose W. M. Jardine as the new president of the University of Wichita. Details.

**Sunday, January 28, 1934****page**

1. Dr. William M. Jardine has accepted the presidency of the University of Wichita and will assume his new duties March 1. Details and photograph.

**Thursday, March 1, 1934****page**

1. Dr. William M. Jardine took over his duties as president of the University of Wichita this morning. Details. Photograph.

**Friday, December 14, 1934****page**

1. President Jardine, of the University of Wichita, calls for paving of the roads on the campus. Details.

**Sunday, September 8, 1940****page**

7. Photo of the new home of the Men of Webster fraternity near the University of Wichita campus, which is to be occupied this week. It is the completely remodeled and redecorated former home of the University President, W. M. Jardine. Article says it was moved from the campus to its present site at 1720 North Vassar. It was moved a block east and one-half block south to its new location on "fraternity row." The stone mantel of the fireplace was once a stairstep at old Fairmount Hall. The cost of project

was \$14,000.
