Dr. Edward N. Tihen (1924-1991) was an avid reader and researcher of Wichita newspapers. His notes from Wichita newspapers -- the "Tihen Notes," as we call them -- provide an excellent starting point for further research. They present brief synopses of newspaper articles, identify the newspaper -- Eagle, Beacon or Eagle-Beacon -- in which the stories first appeared, and give exact references to the pages on which the articles are found. Microfilmed copies of these newspapers are available at the Wichita State University Libraries, the Wichita Public Library, or by interlibrary loan from the Kansas State Historical Society.

5. Dr. Tihen, city physician (sic), was called to police headquarters this morning to attend a sick tramp.

Saturday, February 19, 1898 page

5. Mrs. Dr. H. B. Tihen and Master Henry Tihen, of Andale, are for a few days the guests of Mr. and Mrs. W. H. Rauch of North Lawrence avenue.

Friday, July 28, 1911 page

8. Mrs. Roer and daughters Helen and Marie, and Mrs. Wagner and son William, were in Wichita Wednesday, the guests of Mrs. W. A. Polk and Miss McLaughlin. They are sisters of Bishop Tihen and after attending the installation ceremonies at Lincoln they went to Andale to visit their brother, Dr. Tihen, and his family. They left last night for Jefferson City.

14. Report of death yesterday of Dr. Herman B. Tihen, age 64, physician at Andale for past 41 years. Obituary. Survived by widow, one son and two daughters (named). Also by three brothers, Bishop J. H. Tihen; William Tihen, of Harper; and John Tihen, Jefferson City, Missouri; and five sisters: Mrs. Ben Veith, St. Louis; Mrs. Anna Roer, Jefferson City, Missouri; Mrs. C. N. Hill, Higginsville, Missouri; and Mrs. Kate Wagner, Kansas City, Kansas (only four sisters listed) and seven grandchildren.
